Lindsay Lohan Handcuffed, Jailed, Released on Bail Within Hours

The 25-year-old was fired from her community service stint at a Downtown Women's Shelter.

LOS ANGELES (KTLA) -- Troubled actress Lindsay Lohan is out on bail just hours after having her probation revoked for failure to comply with her court-ordered community service.

In back-and-forth arguments with defense attorney Shawn Chapman Holley before making the ruling, the judge read aloud in court a statement that Lohan made regarding her unsuccessful community service at a downtown Los Angeles women's center: "She said she wasn't interacting with anyone so it wasn't fulfilling."

Judge Stephanie Sautner harshly reprimanded Lohan.

"Is that what it's supposed to be about -- fulfilling? Or is it supposed to be punitive," the judge told Lohan's attorney, standing beside the actress, who was seated at the defense table.

"Her probation would have been done last year if she had done what she was supposed to do," the judge said. "There has been violation after violation. You have been doing this a long time. I have been doing this a long time.... Probation is a gift. It's not a right."

"We all can't be fulfilled by what we do," the judge added.

Her attorney responded: "She understands that."

"You haven't shown me before July 21 (which was Lohan's last court appearance) ... and September 9, how many hours she has done at the downtown women's center. I'm thinking maybe two -- with nine absences," the judge said. "It says she blew them off and left after an hour or an hour and half."

"I am revoking her probation," the judge said.

"And I'm also setting bail at \$100,000."

Lohan was removed from the courtroom in handcuffs with her bail bondsman right behind her.

Within an hour, Lohan had posted the \$100,000 bail.

She was released a short time later.

Sautner said earlier Wednesday that if Lohan made bail, the actress must perform 16 hours of community service a week -- over a minimum of two days a week -- at the Los Angeles County morgue before her probation violation hearing on November 2.

In April, Sautner ordered Lohan to a combined 480 hours of community service, to be completed by next April as part of her probation in a shoplifting case involving a \$2,500 necklace.

The judge said the bulk of those hours were to be completed specifically at the Downtown Women's Center.

Lohan completed only 12 of the required 360 hours, according to prosecutors, and was terminated from the assignment.

Lohan then began her community service with the Red Cross, which Sautner said would not count toward her probation. The judge condemned the Probation Department -- which gave Lohan a glowing report -- for reassigning the actress to the Red Cross.

Sautner also noted that it took 6 months for Lohan to complete a 12-hour Shoplifter's Alternative course, which she finished Tuesday night.

The judge said, "Are you noticing a trend?"

Lohan could face up to a year and a half in jail.
